

### **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

Effective May 26, 2011 the Technical College System of Georgia's (TCSG) Technical Colleges (COE and SACS-COC accredited) and DeVry University/Georgia have agreed to renew their educational partnership and provide graduates from Georgia's two-year technical colleges the opportunity to "seamlessly" further their education to a bachelor level at DeVry University.

DeVry University agrees to evaluate and accept earned credit hours from TCSG Technical Colleges that meet the academic requirements of DeVry University. Students holding a TCSG associate degree have the opportunity to complete their bachelor's degree utilizing the following guidelines:

1. Students graduating with an associate degree in Accounting, Biomedical Engineering Technology, Computer and Electronics Engineering Technology, Computer Information Systems, Electronics Technology with a specialization in Biomedical Instrumentation Technology, Hotel/Restaurant/Tourism Management, Management and Supervisory Development, or Marketing Management (COE or SACS-COC accredited) may complete their bachelor's degree program at DeVry University in a like field.
2. Students graduating with an associate degree in any program area may complete DeVry University's Bachelor of Science in Technical Management program. Currently, a minimum of 122 semester credit hours is required to graduate with a BSTM from DeVry. Please refer to the enclosed catalog for details on all DeVry University degree programs.
3. Students earning a diploma in any field may complete the requirements for an associate of applied science degree at a TCSG College and become qualified for a bachelor's degree program (see points #1 and #2.)
4. As of the date of this signing, students must earn at least 25 percent of their programs' required credit hours or a minimum of 30 semester-credit hours, whichever is greater, through coursework completed at DeVry. Program credit hours and academic policies, including residency requirements, in force at the time of the student's enrollment will take precedence.

This Memorandum of Understanding will remain in force until such time as it is revised by the parties.
