Who is **Rose Flynn**? A whimsical anomaly, Mrs. Flynn is one of few who can boast about going from student to employee to retiree at Georgia Piedmont Technical College. She began her journey back when Georgia Piedmont was DeKalb Tech, and was a part of the '82 graduating class. Her degree in Computer Science allowed her to get into the field working as a computer programmer for Norell Corporation for a number of years. After starting her young family, she was still in such demand that the company made special provisions for her to be able to work from home! Transitioning into being a full-time stay-at-home mom, Mrs. Flynn took time away from the workforce to raise her two children.



Eventually, she attended Savannah College of Art and Design earning a degree in Fine Arts. The ever-changing landscape of technology presented an exciting way to merge her two degrees where Mrs. Flynn could, in her own way, help pioneer the world of computer graphics. She easily laughed about the days of black and white computer screens, modems, and dial-up internet while working at IBM full-time. An opportunity to get back into the technical college system presented itself through Georgia Quick Start, a program under the Department of Technical Education (DTE) system (later Technical College System of Georgia). It was there that she really honed the skills that would propel her into a flourishing career. Georgia Technical College later brought her on as their Creative Services Director until the then president of DeKalb Tech offered her a position as the school's first ever graphic designer and Creative Services Director.

For the first time, she was able to work, not only for, but also with the students of a school. This exciting opportunity was one that she welcomed with open arms. Rose spoke of fond memories throughout her career, however two in particular came from her days as a student at DeKalb Tech. She had two main professors, Robert Smith, now retired, and his brother Ron, who taught computer science courses and main subject courses respectively. Ron had a saying, "One step at a time," referencing a song from the 50's by Brenda Lee. Having an inside connect into the Nashville music circuit, Mrs. Flynn was able to get a personally autographed picture of the famed singer for Ron with those words signed on it.

His brother, Robert, introduced the stock market to the class on the first day of an accounting class. He gave them an allowance of \$100 worth of play money and used that to teach them how to follow the market. Of course, as a Computer Science major, Mrs. Flynn chose the company Intel to 'invest' in.
