

GPTC's Law Enforcement Academy Receives National Reaccreditation Again

Georgia Piedmont Technical College Law Enforcement Academy (GPTCLEA) achieves their first reaccreditation from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). In 2014 GPTCLEA became the first law enforcement training academy in the State of Georgia to attain an International accreditation from CALEA. On July 29th in Providence, Rhode Island, CALEA granted the Law Enforcement Academy their first reaccreditation. GPTCLEA continues to be the only training academy in the State that holds a CALEA accreditation.

According to the director of Georgia Piedmont Technical College's Law Enforcement Academy, Major Harry McCann, this is a significant achievement.

"It shows that we are doing what our policies and procedures say we should be doing when it comes to the best practices of running a law enforcement academy."
