Georgia Piedmont Technical College's Licensed Practical Nursing Program RANKED #1 IN STATE



What an honor it is to have GPTC's Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) Program be ranked #1 in the state of Georgia by www.practicalnursing.org, a website dedicated to providing substantive information to prospective students who are considering a career in nursing. There were 22 other LPN Programs evaluated on a number of qualifying criteria. Astoundingly, the program achieved a 100% pass rate on the National Council Licensure Examination for Practical Nursing (NCLEX-PN) from 2012 through 2015, which was practical nursing org's evaluation period. We would also like to send a warm congratulations to those who ranked immediately after GPTC; Ogeechee Technical College in Statesboro placed second and Chattahoochee Technical College in Marietta placed third.
